- 6. Eligibility to obtain a visa for travel to Australia
- 7. Availability to travel to and remain in Australia for the period 28 March to 1 April 2012.

DSEWPaC will support up to two representatives from your country, preferably one government representative and one community representative.

DSEWPaC is particularly keen to support women involved in community based projects, and strongly encourages community representative bodies to nominate a women to participate, of for women to nominate themselves. .
